




#### Why stakeholders and the public should be involved in research

- History shows us that projects that successfully engage a wide variety of stakeholders and citizens produce more robust and effective outcomes







#### Why stakeholders and the public should be involved in RECIPES


- RECIPES deals with the precautionary principle, which is a topic that
  has spurred diverse and even conflicting opinions in political debates as
  well as in academia
- The precautionary principle is interpreted with variations according to the regulators, policy makers and academics that apply it
- We needed to uncover these various interpretations to provide useful guidance
- Therefore, we needed to look at how the precautionary principle is defined in literature, used in cases, and perceived by stakeholders and citizens










### The theoretical timeline of engagement in RECIPES










- Agenda setting


#### The engagement process was carried out for the RECIPES project to gain insight into:

- How stakeholders weigh different needs, arguments, and ethical issues against one another




#### Based on the engagement process the project were able to include:


- Agenda setting
